Awa Odori is a traditional dance, said to have a history of over 400 years, and is a cultural treasure that Tokushima proudly presents to the world.



Every August, during the Awa Odori dance festival, over a million visitors from Japan and around the world flock to Tokushima, as the entire city buzzes with energy and celebration.



Awa Odori features two styles of dance: the powerful and dynamic 'male dance' and the graceful and elegant 'female dance'.



Daily Awa Odori performances are held at the Awa Odori Kaikan, and at tonaru SETO on Sundays and public holidays—you can even join in and dance along!





Naruto Whirlpools 鳴門の渦潮



Large whirlpools occur in the Naruto Strait situated between Awaji Island and Shikoku Island, caused by the ebb and flow of the tides. (One of the famous tidal currents in the world)

By boarding the Whirlpool Sightseeing Boat, you can experience the powerful whirlpools up close.

You can view the whirlpools from Onaruto Bridge Promenade "Uzu-no-Michi", with a glass floor 45 meters above the sea.



Otsuka Museum of Art 大塚国際美術館



At the Otsuka Museum of Art, about 1,000 Western masterpieces from over 190 museums in 26 countries are reproduced full-size on ceramic panels using special technology.

Tokushima is full of fresh ingredients—from meat and fish to vegetables and fruits—and offers a variety of delicious dishes.

Indigo Dyeing 藍染



In Tokushima, the production of "sukumo," the base material for indigo dyeing, has long flourished. Known as "Awa-Ai", the "sukumo" produced here has been highly esteemed for its exceptional quality.

Ai-no-Yakata preserves the residence of the Okumura family, once a major indigo merchant, and showcases the history and techniques of indigo. You can also try indigo dyeing experiences.



Awa Ningyo Joruri 阿波人形浄瑠璃



Awa Ningyo Joruri is a traditional performing art from Tokushima, designated as an Important Intangible Folk Cultural Asset by the Japanese government.

At the Awa Jurobe Yashiki (Puppet Theater & Museum), representative performances are held daily, and international visitors can easily enjoy them with English subtitles.



Naruto Uchinoumi Refreshing Cruise 鳴門ウチノ海 爽快クルージング



Enjoy the thrill and refreshing ride on a high-speed inflatable boat (RIB) while exploring the scenic beauty and historic sites of Uchinoumi(Inland Sea) and the Naruto Strait.



French Monster Setouchi Food Art フレンチモンスター 瀬戸内フードアート



This café offers sweets and dishes made with carefully selected ingredients from Tokushima, and the 360-degree panoramic view from the rooftop terrace is also highly recommended.



Honke Matsuura Brewery 本家松浦酒造場



Founded in 1804, this is Tokushima's oldest sake brewery and the home of the renowned sake brand "Narutotai." You can enjoy a guided tour of the brewery and savor its exquisite local sake.



Kamikatsu Zero Waste Center 上勝町ゼロ・ウェイストセンター



At this facility, you can get an inside look at Kamikatsu's unique zero-waste initiatives on a study tour — from 43-category household waste sorting to an impressive recycling rate of over 80%.




RISE & WIN Brewing Co.

IRODORI Harvest & Study Tour いろどり収穫体験・スタディツアー





Awa Bancha Tea 阿波晚茶



You can enjoy a tasting of rare lactic acid-fermented tea, mostly handcrafted by local artisans, with flavors that vary by maker — unique to Kamikatsu and its surroundings.

Mt. Yamainudake 山犬嶽



Mt. Yamainudake Hiking Tour is a popular experience where visitors can enjoy the lush green moss that carpets the area, creating a magical, photogenic landscape full of rich natural beauty.

Kashihara Rice Terraces 樫原の棚田




The Kashihara Rice Terraces form a beautiful landscape with curved contours along the mountainside and have been recognized as a nationally designated Important Cultural Landscape.


Shikoku Henro (Shikoku Pilgrimage) 四国遍路



The Shikoku Pilgrimage is the journey of visiting 88 temples across Shikoku, established around 1,200 years ago by Kobo Daishi (Kukai).

Pilgrimage Temple No.1: Ryozenji 第一番札所 霊山寺



Pilgrimage Temple No.1 is Ryozenji in Naruto City, Tokushima Prefecture. Many pilgrims start their journey from here.

Try on rented "Ohenro" vests (traditional white vest), learn pilgrimage etiquette, and visit Ryozenji.




Pilgrimage Temple No.6: Anrakuji 第六番札所 安楽寺



At Anrakuji, there is a temple lodging with hot springs associated with Kobo Daishi, and you can experience the mystical evening Buddhist service in the main hall.



Pilgrimage Temple No.19: Tatsueji 第十九番札所 立江寺



At Tatsueji, You can try making juzu (prayer beads), stay at the temple lodging, and take part in a special evening goma fire ritual.
